1983 INDIANAPOLIS "500" STATISTICS

There were 93 cars entered in this year's "500," 16 less than the record-setting entry field of 109 cars for the 1982 race....75 arrived at the track....73 took practice runs....34 completed qualification runs....1 car was bumped....that was the least number bumped since 1972, when one car also was bumped....The car bumped was #92 John Mahler. No driver completed a qualifying attempt too slow to bump. There were 30 different cars making attempts with a total of 44 attempts. There were 10 incompiete attempts.

During the month, there were a total of 63 drivers on the track. There were 29 of last year's starting field of 33 on the track. The exceptions were the late Jim Hickman, Hector Rebaque, Dale Whittington and Danny Sullivan. There were 45 veterans and 18 rookies on the track. Gordon Johncock in 1982 was the fifth driver to win from the fifth starting position, breaking a string of three races in a row that had been won from the pole position. the above positions which have zeroes remain zeroes, the following drivers would have no chance of winning this year: Roger Mears, Tony Bettenhausen, Howdy Holmes, Chip Gamassi, Josele Garza, Johnny Parsons, A.J. Foyt, Geoff Brabham, Scott Brayton, Mike Chandler, Steve Krisiloff, Chet Fillip and Dennis Firestone.

Teo Fabi and Mike Mosley appear to have the best starting spots from the statistical standpoint, since first-place starters have won 12 times and second-place starters 10

For the fourth straight year, there will be no woman starter in the race. Janet Guthrie, only woman who ever made the field, did not participate this year. She was in the 1977, '78 and '79 races. Desire Wilson did not arrive in time to complete her refresher test this year.

The farthest back that a winner has ever started was 28th position. In 1911, Ray Harroun started from that spot and won the first race. In 1936, Louis Meyer became a three-time winner after starting from that spot. The worst a pole car ever finished was in 1929 when Cliff Woodbury started there and crashed on the fourth lap to take 33rd and last spot in the standings.

In 1930, Billy Arnold started on the pole and nearly accomplished the "impossible." He lost the lead at the start, but after working his way into the lead on the third lap, led the remaining 198 laps to win.

Tommy Milton became the first two-time winner of the "500" in 1923. The first three-time winner was Louis Meyer, who accomplished that feat in 1936. The first four-time winner was A.J. Foyt in 1977. The first man to win the race twice in a row was Wilbur Shaw, who won in 1939 and 1940, for the second and third times. Other consecutive winners were Mauri Rose (1947-48), Bill Vukovich Sr. (1953-54) and Al Unser Sr. (1970-71). No man has ever won three in a row. A.J. Foyt is the only four-time winner of the race (1961, 64, 67, 77); three-time winners besides Meyer are Shaw (1937, 39, 40), Rose (1941, 47, 48), Al Unser (1970, 71, 78), Johnny Rutherford (1974, 76, 80) and Bobby Unser (1968, 75, 81). The two-time winners, besides Milton, are Vukovich (1953-54), Rodger Ward (1959-62) and Gordon Johncock (1973-82).

In 1959, the defending winner, Jimmy Bryan, failed to get started at the beginning of the race. In 1936, Bill Cummings, the 1934 winner, failed to move from his starting spot due to a broken clutch stud.

In 1970, Jim Malloy hit the fourth turn (NW) wall on the pace lap and the race had to be halted. In 1957, Elmer George and Eddie Russo collided on the backstretch and were eliminated on the parade lap. In 1982, four cars were eliminated in an aborted start, those of Kevin Cogan, Mario Andretti, Roger Mears and Dale Whittington.

The 1982 race winner, Gordon Johncock, gave car #20 its second Indy victory. The other one also was by Johncock when he had #20 on his 1973 winner. Car #2 leads in victories with eight; car #1 has seven, car #14 has five and #16 has four.

1983 INDIANAPOLIS 500 ROOKIE TEST REPORT

Rookie tests in 1983 were conducted in two phases of 20 laps (50 miles) each; the first phase at 170-plus miles per hour and the second phase at 180 or above. The last 10 laps of Phase 2 for drivers taking their first-year tests were observed by a crew of veteran drivers. Refresher tests were 20 laps (50 miles) at 175 or above, according to bulletin.

#1 - Saturday, May 7, 1983

TODAY'S FAST FIVE: Rick Mears (#2) - 196.377; Rick Mears (#2T) - 194.174; A1 Unser Jr. - 192.225; John Paul Jr., - 190.355.

Rick Mears took both of the first two spots on the speed ladder on a windy day interrupted several times by brief showers as practice opened today for the 67th annual Indianapolis 500-Mile Race.

The 1979 winner turned in a 196.377 clocking in his primary #2 Pennzoil Penske/Cosworth, after earlier recording a 194.174 speed in his "backup" #2T Pennzoil Penske/Cosworth.

Al Unser Jr., who got in 10 laps of his 20-lap required second phase of the driver's test, was next behind Mears with a 192.225 speed in his #19 Coors Light Silver Bullet Eagle/Cosworth. Another second-generation rookie, John Paul Jr., has the next best speed of 190.355 in his #12 V.D.S. Associates Penske/Cosworth. Paul also got in 10 laps of his second phase, as did Irishman and former Grand Prix star Derek Daly, who had a day's personal high speed of 183.598.

Fifth best speed was turned in by Tony Bettenhausen at 189.473 in his #10 Provimi Veal March/Cosworth.

Next was Pete Halsmer in the #66 Colonial Breas-Arciero Penske/Cosworth at 186.8. Seventh was Al Unser Sr. at 185.605 in his Hertz-Penske/Cosworth. Eighth was Roger Mears, Rick's older brother, at 184.880 in the #9 Machinists Union Racing Team Penske/Cosworth. Ninth was 1969 winner Mario Andretti, who "shook down" his #3 Newman/Haas Budweiser Lola/Cosworth at 184.237. Tenth was Daly.

Taking "first man on the track" honors was Bill Tempero, who piloted his #15 M.W. Tempero/Cornelius BTR Bullet/Chevy onto the asphalt just secondsafter the green light came on at 1:22 p.m. following ceremonies and a drive-around-the-track by 523 motorists who had attended the Mayor's Breakfast downtown. Tempero's speed was recorded for posterity at 113.9 miles per hour. Mayor Bill Hudnut said Pace Car Driver Duke Nalon bettered that by at least a mile per hour in taking Hizzoner around the circuit.

The green had been on for only 12 minutes when the first accident of the official 1983 practice period happened. Rookie Rich Vogler, driving the #8 Leader Card Racers Watson/Cosworth, said he was traveling at about 130 miles per hour when he suddenly lost control in the third turn. The car spun 1½ turns and hit the wall with the left rear and then left front, scraping 280 feet along the concrete. It then slid another 280 feet away from the wall, stopping in the infield grass of the north short chute. Vogler was checked at the infield hospital and pronounced okay. There was serious damage to the left rear of the car. Chief Mechanic A.J. Watson said later that he was sure "something broke" to cause the accident.

There was a total of 22 cars on the track with 21 different drivers. Others not already mentioned were #17 Dick Simon, #28 Gary Bettenhausen, #41 Doug Heveron, #56 Steve Chassey, #55 Josele Garza, #69 Jerry Sneva, #73 Chris Kneifel, #81 Herm Johnson and #88 Roger Rager. At the 6 p.m. close of business, there were 53 cars in the garage area, 38 had passed initial inspection and 51 drivers have passed physical examination.

The speed limit for the day started at 180, was raised to 190 by Chief Steward Tom Binford at 3:30 p.m. and was lifted entirely at 4:15 p.m. Binford announced that Johnny Capels, chief mechanic of Car #21 driven by Pancho Carter, was fined \$500 for using a part in his pop-off valve that did not meet USAC specifications.

Rick Mears pushed the Speedway practice pace over the 200-miles-an-hour mark on a windy Sunday at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway. Mears had a quick lap of 202.565 in his #2 Pennzoil Penske/Cosworth. Rick said "it was a little tricky with the wind out there. It was not as bad as yesterday (Saturday). Everything was turned around because the wind was in a different direction."

Also at or above the speed it is expected to take to make the 67th running of the Indianapolis 500 were Howdy Holmes at 198.281 in the #30 Domino's Pizza "Hot One" March/Cosworth; Al Unser Sr. at 198.063 in the #7 Hertz Penske Penske/Cosworth; Al Unser Jr., at 197.411 in the #19 Coors Light Silver Bullet Eagle/Cosworth; Roger Mears at 197.281 in the #9 Machinists Union Racing Team Penske/Cosworth; Pancho Carter at 195.907 in the #21 Alex Foods Pinata Special March/Cosworth; Pete Halsmer at 195.524 in the #66 Colonial Bread-Arciero PC-10/Cosworth; Mario Andretti at 195.439 in the #3 Newman/Haas Budweiser Lola/Cosworth and Kevin Cogan at 195.058 in the #16 Bignotti-Cotter March/Cosworth.

Veteran Johnny Rutherford, a three-time winner of the 500, pretty well wiped out his #40 Sea Ray Boats Special Wildcat/Cosworth in the early afternoon. Rutherford got too high in Turn-1 (Southwest) slid 660 feet, making a half spin, hit the wall and slid along the wall for 460 feet, slid another 420 feet away from the wall down into the south short chute infield grass. Rutherford suffered a puncture wound that required five stitches at Methodist Hospital to close, plus bruises to his left ankle and heel. He was back out at the track before the 6 p.m. quitting time. Rutherford said he wasn't sure just what happened.

Rookie Chuck Ciprich did two complete spins in the north short chute earlier in the day, sliding some 700 feet, but made no contact with the wall and was towed into the pits. Rookie Pat Bedard also thrilled himself when his #35 Escort Radar Warning Special March/Cosworth lost its left front wheel on Turn-1 (Southwest). "We've already made the new car warranty claim to March," Bedard joked later, "I know we didn't abuse the car. I hadn't stood on it. I hadn't even shifted into fourth."

There were 35 cars on the track, an unusually high number for the second day of practice. Other high speeds were 194.889 by Bobby Rahal in the #4 Red Roof Inns March/Cosworth; 194-plus by Rick Mears in his backup #2T Pennzoil Penske/Cosworth; 192.381 by Gordon Johncock, the defending champion, in the #20 STP Oil Treatment Wildcat/Cosworth; 191.397 by rookie John Paul in the #12 V.D.S. Associates Inc. Penske/Cosworth; 191.489 by Tony Bettenhausen in the #10 Promimi Veal March/Cosworth, and 190.920 by Josele Garza in the #55 National Health Spas/Machinists Union Penske/Cosworth, and 190.756 by Bedard.

Four rookies completed their second phase of their drivers' tests and received the O.K. from a group of veteran drivers. They were Unser Jr., Paul, Doug Heveron in the #41 Andre Wildcat Special Wildcat/Cosworth, and Derek Daly in the #54 Wysard Motor Company March/Cosworth. Steve Chassey got in 10 laps, half of his refresher test at 180 and up. Chuck Ciprich completed 11 laps of the first phase (170 mph) of his test.

At the close of business Sunday, there were 60 cars at the track out of the 93 entered, 50 cars had completed initial technical inspection and 55 drivers had finished their physical examinations.

Bedard who went the fastest he's ever driven said, "It's an incredible feeling! It's not just the speed. We'll do better than that. It's that finally, after all this time working for it, the effort is paying off this year with the Escort Radar. I've got a great crew, and they're doing it the right way."



#3 - Monday, May 9, 1983

TODAY'S FAST FIVE: Rick Mears - 203.850; Kevin Cogan - 201.929; Mike Mosley - 201.838; Bobby Rahal - 201.207; Howdy Holmes - 200.088

Five different drivers bettered the 200 miles-an-hour mark today on the best day for running so far in the 1983 practice period. Rick Mears led the speed parade for the third consecutive day, chalking up a 203.850 clocking in his #2 Pennzoil Penske/Cosworth.

Kevin Cogan turned in the second quick speed of 201.929 in his #16 Bignotti-Cotter March/Cosworth. Mike Mosley was third at 201.838 in his #18 Kraco Car Stereo March/Cosworth. Also above the "magic mark" of 200 were Bobby Rahal at 201.207 in the #4 Red Roof Inns March/Cosworth and Howdy Holmes at 200.088 in the #30 Domino's Pizza "Hot One" March/Cosworth.

Al Unser Jr. just missed joining the select group with a 199.366 speed in his #19 Coors Light Silver Bullet Eagle/Cosworth. So did Pete Halsmer who had a 199.645 lap in his #66 Colonial Bread-Arciero Eagle/Chevy. Next on the speed chart was John Paul Jr., at 198.456 in his #12 V.D.S. Associates Penske/Cosworth. Mears in his backup #2T Pennzoil Penske/Cosworth was next at 198.150 and 10th on the day's speed parade was Tony Bettenhausen at 197.889 in his #10 Provimi Veal March/Cosworth. Others in the 198 bracket were Al Unser Sr., at 197.498 in his #7 Hertz Penske/Cosworth, Roger Mears at 197.022 in his #9 Machinists Union Penske/Cosworth, Pancho Carter at 197.541 in his #21 Alex Foods Pinata March/Cosworth.

Others turning in respectable speed were Al Unser in the #2T backup at 195.779, rookie Teo Fabi in the newly sponsored #33 Skoal Bandit March/Cosworth at 195.1; Josele Garza at 194.049 in the #55 National Health Spas/Machinists Union Penske/Cosworth; Pat Bedard at 191.774 in the #35 Escort Radar Warning March/Cosworth, Chris Kneifel at 191.204 in the #72 Primus Racing Primus/Cosworth.

Both Fabi and Kneifel completed their rookie tests and got the O.K. from a group of veteran drivers who watched their last 20 laps at 180 and up.

The legendary A.J. Foyt brought cheers from the large crowd of sun-baked spectators in the Tower Terrace Section at 4:35 p.m. when he strode out behind his #14 Gilmore-Valvoline March/Cosworth and put on his helmet. Foyt was content to "shake down" with a top speed of 100.127 miles per hour.

Jerry Sneva, driving the Little King's Cream Ale #69 March/Cosworth, lost control coming out of the third (northeast) turn in late afternoon and spun two complete circuits. The car did not make wall contact and outside of a set of flat-spotted tires and a little loss: of pride, Jerry was perfectly all right.

There were 3° cars on the track during the day. Steve Chassey completed his refresher test in the #56 Genesee Beer/Sizzler Steak/WRTV Eagle/Chevy and got the okay to practice at higher speeds.

At the close of the day, there were 61 cars at the track, 53 had passed initial technical inspection and 58 drivers had passed their physical examinations.

Rick Mears commented, "We're working pretty hard at it. Conditions were excellent. I see the other guys are creeping up on us, so we have to work a little harder. I think we'll get there."



#4, Tuesday, May 10, 1983

TODAY'S FAST FIVE: Rick Mears 204.498; Don Whittington 203.297; Teo Fabi 202.639; Bobby Rahal 202.611; Al Unser Sr. 201.477

Rapid Rick Mears waiting until the last 10 minutes of a near-perfect practice day at the Indianapolis Motor Speedway today to set the day's fastest speed--for the fourth consecutive day. Mears' 204.498 was the fastest practice speed of the month, achieved in his #2 Pennzoil Penske/Cosworth.

There were a total of seven drivers over the "magic" 200-miles-an hour mark today, including two rookies. That brought the total number of drivers for the practice period who have joined the "200 Club" to 10.

Don Whittington was the day's second fastest traveler at 203.297 in the #91 Simoniz Finish March/Cosworth. Rookie Teo Fabi, an Italian, was third quick at 202.939 in the #33 Forsythe Racing's Skoal Bandit.

Bobby Rahal was fourth at 202.611 in the #4 Red Roof Inns March/Cosworth. The report from Methodist Hospital was that Johnny suffered a fractured right ankle and a broken bone in his left foot in the 4:25 p.m. accident. Johnny was practicing in the #40 Sea Ray Boats Wildcat/Cosworth in high winds when he reportedly get high in the third (northeast) turn, did a half-spin covering 440 feet, hit the wall with the left side of the car, continued three feet away from the wall for 680 feet, hit the wall again and glanced along the wall an additional 240 feet. The car stopped in the fourth (northwest) turn against the wall and backwards. The left side of the car was damaged extensively, making it doubtful it could be repaired for this weekend's time trials. Rutherford was reported awake and alert. He was scheduled for surgery on the ankle and foot late today. Rutherford's high lap for the day was 194.174.

Mike Mosley had the day's quick speed of 201.072 in his backup #18T Kraco Car Stereo March/Cosworth. Only other driver who got over the 200 mark was rookie Teo Fabi at 200.624 in the #33 Forsythe Racing Skoal Bandit. Gordon Johncock, a two-time winner, got 198.544 in the #20 STP Oil Treatment Wildcat/Cosworth. Bill Whittington hit 197.889 in the #94 Whittington Brothers March/Cosworth. Fourth was the crew of Ken Schrader's #98 Friendship Special headed by Grant King and Ed Baue at 29.727 seconds.

Jury Sheva has withdrawn from his ride in the #69 Little King's Cream Ale March/Cosworth and another driver is yet to be named. Sheva said he has not yet found another car. Missing from the track until this afternoon were Rick Mears and Al Unser. They had been at Michigan International Speedway Tuesday and part of today conducting a 500-mile test in one of their backup cars. Each ran about half the distance as they did 330 miles Tuesday and finished up the other 170 today. There was no report on their speed average. Desire Wilson barely got under the wire when she completed one lap of her 180 miles an hour and up Refresher Test after being delayed first by rain and then by the Rutherford accident.
